

Mark Bridgeman

Deputy President of the CLA

For the last 13 years, Mark Bridgeman has managed the Fallodon Estate on the Northumberland coast near Alnwick, which consists of an in-hand farm, let farms, woodland, biomass, tourism, let properties and housing development.

Having spent 19 years at Schroders as a fund manager, he is now on the board of three London listed investment trusts and a venture capital fund in Newcastle.

Mark has been actively involved in the CLA for 13 years. and is due to be elected as CLA President in November. He joined the CLA Policy Committee seven years ago as the North East's representative and chaired the Legal and Parliamentary and Property Rights Committee from 2011-13, when he also chaired the Housing Working Group that produced the CLA's housing policy document.

From 2013-15 Mark chaired the Environment Committee and from 2015-2017 he chaired the National Policy Committee, and is now Chairman of the CLA Board.





Alex Brewster

Farmer & Nuffield Scholar

Alex Brewster farms and manages 4000Ha in highland Perthshire with a growing herd of 100 Aberdeen Angus cows, a flock of 1900 ewes and 4000 organic free range hens.

Alex's 2016 Nuffield Scholarship focused on maximising the potential of his grassland.

The farm hosted a QMS grazing group looking into increasing the kg of live weight sold per Ha which was the catalyst and backbone for his Nuffield study.

Alex is a director of Scottish Organic Producers Association (SOPA), and he also owns Powered Pasture, which sources and sells equipment to support rotational and paddock grazing. "Over the last few years we have also played with diversity... and through that we've seen the soil biota become more alive and the micro and macro nutrients become more available. We are starting to complete the nutrient cycle."



Lyndsay Chapman

Chief Executive: CIEL (Centre for Innovation Excellence in Livestock)

Lyndsay is the Chief Executive of CIEL and an enthusiast and champion for the promotion of British food, farming and the wider environment.

CIEL is one of the UK's four Agri-Tech Centres established as a key pillar of the government's Agri-Tech Strategy, working in partnership with leading livestock research institutions and a group of industry members spanning the entire Agri-Food supply chain. CIEL aims to use these collaborative partnerships to accelerate business-led livestock innovation, and to identify opportunities to develop new products, services and techniques that could benefit the entire supply chain.

Prior to joining CIEL in 2017, Lyndsay spent 25 years in the UK dairy sector, with positions including Agriculture Director at Müller and Agriculture and Communications Director for Dairy Crest. She held a variety of roles covering communications, business development and corporate responsibility and during this time worked in collaboration with farmers and supply chain partners.
